Introduction of the 4th Cohort SKF Raising Star Students


Ms. **Arisha** joined SKF Learning Center in 2018 at the age of 4, as part of the first batch of the SKF students that got enrolled when SKF center started. Arisha is the only child of her parents.

Her father works in different homes working as a gardener, laborer, cleaner or whatever jobs he can

find, and her mother works as a maid in different homes and together they earn as little

as Rs 15,000 a month. At the time when Arisha joined SKF Learning

center she was a very shy, quite kid but always showed eagerness in learning about new subjects. A bright kid who quickly grasped what was being



Master **Arslan** was also amongst those kids that enrolled in SKF Learning Center at age 4 when it started in 2018. He has two brothers and two sisters.

He is an orphan child. His father passed away in 2015. Mother works at a beauty salon, earing Rs 10,000 per month. Arslan from the start has been an energetic kid interested in outdoor activities and needed constant attention to be attentive in classwork. In November 2022, Arslan joined class two in a regular primary school program. In the first two months of the transition, Arslan has started to show interest in his classwork and has become very responsible and focused on his studies.



Gul Naz joined SKF in 2019 at the age of 7, in the 2nd batch of students enrolled at the SKF Learning Center. She had never been to any school and started at the prep level. Gul Naz from the start showed much interest in her learning and was a very obedient and helpful student in class. In 2022 a medal was given by the staff of SKF for being the most obedient student in her class. She has two sisters and her father died in 2022. Her

mother works as a house maid in different homes.

She transitioned a regular school program in class two at a private primary school in November 2022. In her first term class test Gul Naz scored 150/150 marks and "Excellent "as a remark by her class teacher!
