JULY

During the summer holidays 6 Street Kids Rising Scholar Foundation (SKRSF) students 2 boys and 4 girls, were selected for a 4-week Robotics Summer Camp held at COBOT Lab at Superior Grammar School in Multan along with other local school children. From **June 19th to July 19th**, these SKRSF students were given a total of 20 lectures and hands on training. Transport was provided to the students to attend the summer camp.

Syed Usama Aziz, CEO and Founder of COBOT who has designed a working robot himself was the instructor (https://www.facebook.com/usama.aziz.311). These children got to learn what is a robot, how it works and had hands on training on how to *design a line following robot* and *single lane control system* which can be used for city traffic control.

On **December 2nd** "SKF Holiday Fundraising" USA event was organized by Ms. Shahida, SKF supporter/donor at her residence to introduce SKF and to showcase the work of SKF to a network of females living in the Bay Area.

For the new academic year at SKRSF Learning Center starting from January 2024, before the winter break SKRSF coordinator began interviewing new kids to join SKRSF Learning Center for academic year 2024. Selection was made of **8 new children**, 4 of the kids to join Prep class and 4 to join Class 1, a total of **16 children** at the Learning Center, Multan for the academic year 2024.

SKRSF completed a successful year 2023 benefiting a total of 32 students. Two students from the SKF Rising Star Scholarship program had to drop out from the SKRSF Scholarship program and SKRSF as they did not show any improvement during the school year and failed in the class.

For the academic year 2024, a total of **11 students** got selected to transition from SKRSF Learning Center to a private local school and to become part of **Cohort 5 of "SKF's Rising Star Scholarship Program"**



Each of the student was given new uniform, shoes, school bag, books, copies, stationary. Excited and full of smiles the children began their schooling from **December 15**th



These 11 children joined the "12 SKF's Rising Star Scholarship Students" from cohorts 1, 2, 3 and 4, making the total of 21 students who successfully are going to a regular school program.


